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§ 1-567.38(a) When a party to an international commercial arbitration agreement commences judicial proceedings seeking relief with respect to a matter covered by the agreement to arbitrate, any other party to the agreement may apply to the court for an order to stay the proceedings and compel arbitration.

§ 1-567.38(b) Arbitration proceedings may begin or continue, and an award may be made, while an action described in subsection (a) is pending before the court.
