- § 1-643(a)

Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this Article applies to a collaborative law participation agreement that meets the requirements of G.S. 1-644 signed on or after the effective date of this act.
- § 1-643(b)

This Article does not apply to any claim or proceeding arising under Chapter 35A, 35B, or 50 of the General Statutes.
- § 1-643(c)

Minors, unborn individuals, and individuals who are incompetent shall not be parties to a collaborative law process. (2020-65, s. 1.)
