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§ 106-405(a) Except as provided in G.S. 106-404, any person who knowingly and willfully violates any provision of this Part is guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.

§ 106-405(b) It is prohibited that any person knowingly and willfully:

- (1) Hide or conceal any animals that are subject to a quarantine under this Part.
- (2) Fail to report the occurrence of an animal disease for which a quarantine under this Part is in effect.

§ 106-405(c) Any person who has committed an act that is prohibited under subsection (b) of this section shall be subject to an administrative penalty not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per violation. Each act in violation of subsection (b) of this section is a separate violation.
