As used in this Article:

"Commercial horse feed" means any commercial feed, as defined in G.S. 106-284.33, labeled or marketed for equine use.

"Council" means the North Carolina Horse Council.

"Department" means the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

"Equine" means a horse, pony, mule, donkey, or hinny.

"Horse owner" means a person who (i) is a North Carolina resident and (ii) owns or leases an equine.- (1998-154, s. 1; 2014-103, s. 8.)
