In no case shall self-attestation be used as the sole evidence that an applicant meets eligibility requirements for the food and nutrition services program unless otherwise required by federal law.
- § 108A-52.1(b)

The Department shall count all income and financial resources of an individual determined to be ineligible to participate in the food and nutrition services program under 7 U.S.C. § 2015(f) when determining eligibility and benefit allotment of the household of which the individual is a member. The Department shall not prorate or exclude the income or financial resources of the ineligible individual. (2026-1, s. 3F.1.)
