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- § 10B-105(a)
- A person qualified for electronic notary registration shall meet all of the following requirements:
- (1)

Hold a valid commission as a notary public in the State of North Carolina.
- (2)

Except as otherwise provided, abide by all the provisions of Article 1 of this Chapter.
- (3)

Satisfy the requirements of G.S. 10B-107.
- (4)

Submit an electronic registration form containing no significant misstatement or omission of fact.

The Secretary may deny a registration as an electronic notary as authorized in G.S. 10B-5(d). (2005-391, s. 4; 2022-54, s. 2(e); 2023-57, ss. 2, 7(c).)
