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An electronic notarization shall not be performed if the signer of the electronic document:

Is not in the presence of the electronic notary at the time of notarization; and

Is not personally known to the notary or identified by the evidence in accordance with other provisions of this Chapter; or

For any reason set forth in G.S. 10B-20. (2005-391, s. 4.)
