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- § 127A-175(a)

Provide for mutual aid among the party states in the utilization of the National Guard to cope with emergencies.
- § 127A-175(b)

Permit and encourage a high degree of flexibility in the deployment of National Guard forces in the interest of efficiency.
- § 127A-175(c)

Maximize the effectiveness of the National Guard in those situations which call for its utilization under this Compact.
- § 127A-175(d)

Provide protection for the rights of National Guard personnel when serving in other states on emergency duty.
