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§ 127B-35(a) Civil Action. - The Attorney General may commence a civil action against any person that violates any provision of this Article.

§ 127B-35(b) Remedies. - The court may order any of the following remedies:

- (1) Injunction.
- (2) Payment of restitution to a servicemember in the amount of money unlawfully received from, or required to be refunded to, the servicemember.
- (3) Any other remedy provided under Chapter 75 of the General Statutes.

§ 127B-35(c) Civil Penalty. - The court may assess a civil penalty not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per violation. The clear proceeds of civil penalties imposed pursuant to this section shall be remitted to the Civil Penalty and Forfeiture Fund in accordance with G.S. 115C-457.2. (2019-161, s. 1(a).)
