§ 132-11(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all restrictions on access to public records shall expire 100 years after the creation of the record.

§ 132-11(b) Subsection (a) of this section shall apply to any public record in existence at the time of, or created after, August 18, 2015.

§ 132-11(c) No provision of this section shall be construed to authorize or require the opening of any record that meets any of the following criteria:

- (1) Is ordered to be sealed by any state or federal court, except as provided by that court.
- (2) Is prohibited from being disclosed under federal law, rule, or regulation.
- (3) Contains federal Social Security numbers.
- (4) Is a confidential juvenile record pursuant to Article 30 of Chapter 7B of the General Statutes.
- (5) Contains detailed plans and drawings of public buildings and infrastructure facilities.

§ 132-11(d) For purposes of this section, the custodian of the record shall be the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources or other agency in actual possession of the record.- (2015-218, s. 3; 2015-241, s. 14.30(c); 2023-70, s. 3.)
