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§ 136-89.215(a) Action Required. - A person who receives a bill from the Authority for an unpaid open road toll must take one of the following actions within 30 days of the date of the bill:

- (1) Pay the bill.
- (2) Send a written request to the Authority for a review of the toll.

§ 136-89.215(b) Fee. - If a person does not take one of the actions required under subsection (a) of this section within the required time, the Authority may add a processing fee to the amount the person owes. The processing fee may not exceed nine dollars (\$9.00). A person may not be charged more than seventy-two dollars (\$72.00) in processing fees in a 12-month period.

The Authority must set the processing fee at an amount that does not exceed the costs of collecting the unpaid toll. (2008-225, s. 2; 2010-133, s. 4; 2013-183, s. 5.6; 2013-360, s. 34.30; 2024-15, s. 13(a).)
