ARTICLE 22A - TRESPASSING UPON "POSTED" PROPERTY TO HUNT, FISH, TRAP, OR REMOVE PINE NEEDLES/STRAW

Entrance on navigable waters, etc., for purpose of fishing, hunting or trapping not prohibited.
