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- § 14-160(a)

If any person shall wantonly and willfully injure the personal property of another he shall be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.
- § 14-160(b)

Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a), if any person shall wantonly and willfully injure the personal property of another, causing damage in an amount in excess of two hundred dollars (\$200.00), he shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
- § 14-160(c)

This section applies to injuries to personal property without regard to whether the property is destroyed or not. (1876-7, c. 18; Code, s. 1082; 1885, c. 53; Rev., s. 3676; C.S., s. 4331; 1969, c. 1224, s. 14; 1993, c. 539, s. 105; 1994, Ex. Sess., c. 24, s. 14(c).)
