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§ 14-72.6(a)

CLASS I FELONY

A person is guilty of a Class I felony if he commits any of the following offenses, where the goods are valued in excess of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) but less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000):

- (1) Larceny of goods from a permitted construction site.
- (2) Possessing or receiving of stolen goods, with actual knowledge or having reasonable grounds to believe that the goods were stolen from a permitted construction site.

§ 14-72.6(b)

As used in this section, a "permitted construction site" is a site where a permit, license, or other authorization has been issued by the State or a local governmental entity for the placement of new construction or improvements to real property. (2005-208, s. 1.)
