- The purposes of the Commission shall be as follows:
- To deal fairly and effectively with Indian affairs.
 - To bring local, State, and federal resources into focus for the implementation or continuation of meaningful programs for Indian citizens of the State of North Carolina.
 - To provide aid and protection for Indians as needs are demonstrated; to prevent undue hardships.
 - To hold land in trust for the benefit of State-recognized Indian tribes. This subdivision shall not apply to federally recognized Indian tribes.
 - To assist Indian communities in social and economic development.
 - To promote recognition of and the right of Indians to pursue cultural and religious traditions considered by them to be sacred and meaningful to Native Americans.
