§ 15A-1226(a) Each party has the right to introduce rebuttal evidence concerning matters elicited in the evidence in chief of another party. The judge may permit a party to offer new evidence during rebuttal which could have been offered in the party's case in chief or during a previous rebuttal, but if new evidence is allowed, the other party must be permitted further rebuttal.

§ 15A-1226(b) The judge in his discretion may permit any party to introduce additional evidence at any time prior to verdict.
