§ 160A-825(a) The purpose of this Article is to provide a process for a city in financial distress to transition out of that distress either on its own initiative or with assistance from or under the direction of the Local Government Commission.

§ 160A-825(b) For purposes of this Article, the following terms shall apply:

- (1) City. - As defined in G.S. 160A-1.
- (2) Commission. - The Local Government Commission.
- (3) Council. - As defined in G.S. 160A-1. (2021-124, s. 6.)
