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Special mobile equipment may not tow any vehicle other than the following:

A single passenger vehicle that can carry no more than nine passengers and is carrying no passengers.

A single property-hauling vehicle that has a registered weight of 5,000 pounds or less, is carrying no passengers, and does not exceed its registered weight. (1991 (Reg. Sess., 1992), c. 1015, s. 3; 1999-438, s. 29.)
