ARTICLE 2 - UNIFORM DRIVER'S LICENSE ACT

Authority of Division to cancel license or endorsement.

§ 20-15(a)

The Division shall have authority to cancel any driver's license upon determining any of the following:

- (1) The licensee was not entitled to the issuance of the license under this Chapter.
- (2) The licensee failed to give the required or correct information on the license application or committed fraud in making the application.
- (3) The licensee is no longer authorized under federal law to be legally present in the United States.
- (4) The licensee suffers from a physical or mental disability or disease that affects his or her ability to safely operate a motor vehicle, as determined by the applicable State or federal law, rule, or regulation.
- (5) The licensee has failed to submit the certificate required under G.S. 20-7(e) and G.S. 20-9(g).

§ 20-15(b)

Upon such cancellation, the licensee must surrender the license so cancelled to the Division.

§ 20-15(c)

Any person whose license is canceled under this section for failure to give the required or correct information, or for committing fraud, in an application for a commercial drivers license shall be prohibited from reapplying for a commercial drivers license for a period of 60 days from the date of cancellation.

§ 20-15(d)

The Division shall have authority to revoke an H endorsement of a commercial drivers license holder if the person with the endorsement is determined by the federal Transportation Security Administration to constitute a security threat, as specified in 49 C.F.R. § 1572.5(d)(4).

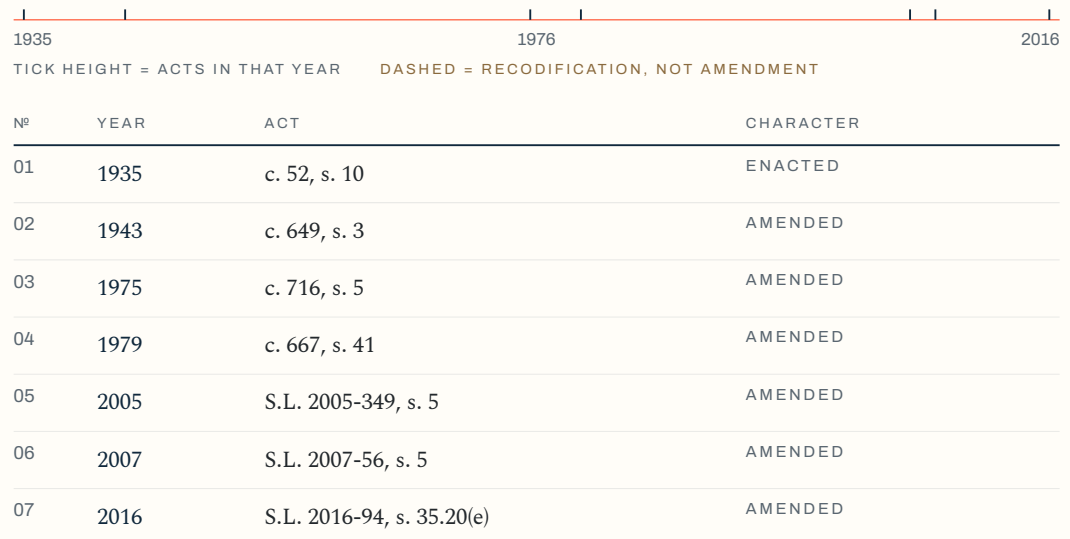
