§ 25B-1(a) No married woman shall be denied credit in her own name if her uncommingled earnings, separate property or other assets are such that a man possessing the same amount of uncommingled earnings, separate property or other assets would receive credit.

§ 25B-1(b) No unmarried woman shall be denied credit in her own name if her property, earnings or other assets are such that a man possessing the same amount of property, earnings or other assets would receive credit.

§ 25B-1(c) For the purposes of this section, "credit" means the obtaining of money, property, labor or services on a deferred-payment basis.
