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§ 28B-3(a) Notice of the hearing on the complaint to appoint a receiver shall be given to all persons named in the petition by registered mail or certified mail with return receipt requested.

§ 28B-3(b) The judge shall hear evidence on the questions of whether the person alleged to be missing or captured is an absentee in military service as defined by G.S. 28B-1, on the question of the necessity for the appointment of a receiver, and on the question of who is entitled to appointment as the receiver.

§ 28B-3(c) The court may in its discretion appoint a guardian ad litem to represent the alleged absentee in military service at the hearing.
