



ARTICLE 10 - RETURNS AND ACCOUNTING

Inventory within three months.

Every guardian, within three months after his appointment, shall file with the clerk an inventory, upon oath, of the estate of his ward; but the clerk may extend such time not exceeding six months, for good cause shown.
