A deposit is a special deposit if all of the following apply:

The deposit is a deposit of funds in a bank under an account agreement.

The deposit is for the benefit of at least two beneficiaries, one or more of which may be a depositor.

The deposit is denominated in a medium of exchange that is currently authorized or adopted by a domestic or foreign government.

The deposit is for a permissible purpose stated in the account agreement.

The deposit is subject to a contingency. (2025-25, s. 158.)
