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§ 62-152.2(a) For the purposes of this section, "standard transportation practices" means:

- (1) Uniform cargo liability rules.
- (2) Uniform bills of lading or receipts for property being transported.
- (3) Uniform cargo credit rules.
- (4) Antitrust immunity for joint line rates or routes, classification, and mileage guides.

§ 62-152.2(b) A person otherwise exempt from regulation by the Commission under Public Law 103-305 may file an application with the Commission to participate in one or more standard transportation practices under rules set out by the Commission.
