A veteran may not be interred in a State veterans cemetery under any of the following circumstances:

He was discharged or dismissed on the grounds that:

- a.He was a conscientious objector who refused to perform military duty;
- b.He was a deserter; or
- c.He was an officer who accepted his resignation for the good of the service;

He was convicted of subversive activities against the United States after separation from active military service; or

He was separated from the Armed Forces of the United States for the good of the service due to a willful and persistent unauthorized absence and issued a Clemency Discharge (DD Form 1953) pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 4313. (1987 (Reg. Sess., 1988), c. 1051, s. 1.)
