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The following definitions apply in this Article:

Cable service. - Defined in G.S. 105-164.3.

Cable system. - Defined in 47 U.S.C. § 522.

Channel. - A portion of the electromagnetic frequency spectrum that is used in a cable system and is capable of delivering a television channel.

Existing agreement. - A local franchise agreement that was awarded under G.S. 153A-137 or G.S. 160A-319 and meets either of the following:

- a.Is in effect on January 1, 2007.
- b.Expired before January 1, 2007, and the cable service provider under the agreement provides cable service to subscribers in the franchise area on January 1, 2007.

Pass a household. - Make service available to a household, regardless of whether the household subscribes to the service.

PEG channel. - A public, educational, or governmental access channel provided to a county or city.

Secretary. - The Secretary of State.

Video programming. - Defined in G.S. 105-164.3. (2006-151, s. 1.)
