- § 90-21.179(a)

Licensure and disciplinary records are deemed investigative.
- § 90-21.179(b)

In addition to authority granted to a member board by its respective medical practice act or other applicable state law, a member board may participate with other member boards in joint investigations of physicians licensed by the member boards.
- § 90-21.179(c)

A subpoena issued by a member state shall be enforceable in other member states.
- § 90-21.179(d)

Member boards may share any investigative, litigation, or compliance materials in furtherance of any joint or individual investigation initiated under the Compact.
- § 90-21.179(e)

Any member state may investigate actual or alleged violations of the statutes authorizing the practice of medicine in any other member state in which a physician holds a license to practice medicine. (2025-37, s. 1(a).)
