ARTICLE 20 - NURSING HOME ADMINISTRATOR ACT

N.C.G.S. § 90-285.1.

Suspension, revocation or refusal to issue a license.

The Board may suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue a license or may reprimand or otherwise discipline a licensee after due notice and an opportunity to be heard at a formal hearing, upon substantial evidence that a licensee:

Has violated the provisions of this Article or the rules adopted by the Board;

Has violated the provisions of Part 2 of Article 6 of Chapter 131E of the General Statutes and rules promulgated thereunder;

Has been convicted of, or has tendered and has had accepted a plea of no contest to, a criminal offense showing professional unfitness;

Has practiced fraud, deceit, or misrepresentation in securing or procuring a nursing home administrator license;

Is incompetent to engage in the practice of nursing home administration or to act as a nursing home administrator;

Has practiced fraud, deceit, or misrepresentation in his or her capacity as a nursing home administrator;

Has committed acts of misconduct in the operation of a nursing home under his jurisdiction;

Is addicted or dependent upon the use of alcohol or any controlled substance, including morphine, opium, cocaine, or other drugs recognized as resulting in abnormal behavior;

Has practiced without being registered biennially;

Has transferred or surrendered possession of, either temporarily or permanently, his or her license or certificate to any other person;

Has paid, given, has caused to be paid or given or offered to pay or to give to any person a commission or other valuable consideration for the solicitation or procurement, either directly or indirectly, of nursing home patronage;

Has been guilty of fraudulent, misleading, or deceptive advertising;

Has falsely impersonated another licensee;

Has failed to exercise regard for the safety, health or life of the patient;

Has permitted unauthorized disclosure of information relating to a patient or his or her records; or

Has discriminated among patients, employees, or staff on account of race, gender, religion, color, national origin, mental or physical disability, or any other class protected by State or federal law.
